Gilbert G. Hilkemeyer Scholarship Guidelines Three Rivers Electric Cooperative

Eligibility: Limited to sons or daughters of Three Rivers Electric Cooperative (TREC) members (children and grandchildren of TREC employees and board members are not eligible). The scholarship is based on financial need of the student.

Must be a full-time student carrying at least 15 credit hours each semester.

Payment of the \$2,000 scholarship will be in two equal installments, with the check made out jointly to the student and the school. Any public or private university or junior college in the State of Missouri qualifies as an eligible school.

Applications are available at the offices of high school counselors or from TREC's offices in Linn or Brazito. Applications must be submitted with copies of high school transcripts, ACT results, three letters of recommendation, and a statement from the student explaining why he/she is deserving of the scholarship.

Renewable:

This two-year scholarship may be renewed the second year if the student is in good standing and has a 3.0 GPA. Student must submit transcript with grades and class schedule following each semester.

Timetable:

Applications will be accepted until April 2, 2019.

Selection:

A three-person committee will review applications and select finalists for interviews to determine the recipient.
